This profile gives you a preview of some of the major items that will be available, so please take a few minutes to look it over and think about what items you're interested in bidding on.

SPECIAL PERMIT HUNTS:

Special Arizona Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep tag. Valid for any Rocky Mountain bighorn ram in the South Fork Hunt Area in units 1 and 2B; Black River Hunt Area in units 1 and 27; unit 6A; Rocky Moun-



tain Hunt Area in units 22, 23, and 24A; Upper Blue River Hunt Area in unit 27; unit 27 south of FR 217 and west of US Highway 191; and unit 28 north of US Highway 70, from August 15, 2024 through August 14, 2025. The buyer of the special tag must specify who the hunter will be within 60 days of purchasing the tag. Arizona has a well-deserved reputation as an outstanding state to take a record-class Rocky Mountain bighorn, with many rams making the Boone and Crockett record book with scores ranging as high as 195 net Boone and Crockett points!

Special Arizona mountain lion tag. Valid for all areas statewide except Camp Navajo in unit 6B, Mohave County Park lands in unit 16A, and Fort Huachuca in unit 35A, from August 15, 2024 through August 14, 2025. Archery-only in units 11M, 25M, 26M, and 38M. The buyer of the special tag must specify who the hunter will be within 60 days of purchasing the tag.

Special Arizona statewide antelope tag. Valid for

any buck antelope in units 1 – 10 (except Camp Navajo in unit 6B), 12A, 12B, 13A, 13B, 15A, 15B, 17A, 17B, 18A, 18B, portions of 19A, 19B, 30A, 31, 32, 34A, 34B, 35A (except Fort Huachuca), and 35B from August 15, 2024 through August 14, 2025. Certain portions of unit 19A are closed to hunting and others are archery-only, but you can use a rifle in all other open units. The buyer of the special tag must specify who the hunter will be within 60 days of purchasing the tag. Arizona dominates the top listings in the Boone and Crockett record book, and most of those entries were taken in recent vears. This is the finest opportunity anywhere to take an antelope that will rank well up in record books!

Navajo Nation trophy mule deer hunt. This trophy deer tag is valid for any seven consecutive days from December 1 through December 31, 2024 in Navaio Nation units 1 – 5. The Navajo Nation has some truly huge mule deer, and this tag gives you the opportunity to hunt them during the rut, when they're out and moving! Don't miss out on it! The purchaser of this permit must hire a licensed Navajo guide. There are restrictions on the use of aircraft for scouting and, with the exception of your Navajo quide, only immediate family members may accompany you on the

La Palmosa Ranch, Mexico, desert bighorn sheep hunt. We are happy to once again offer this spectacular desert bighorn sheep hunt on the sprawling La Palmosa Ranch in Cuatrocienegas, Coahuila, Mexico. This seven day free range hunt is planned for mid to late October of 2024, although the dates can be moved pending availability. The 100,000 acre La Palmosa Ranch is the result of a vision to restore native wildlife, both big game and non-game species, to the Chihuahuan desert of northern Coahuila. The buyer of this hunt will be only the second hunter of the season, making him or her able to go after one of the biggest rams that the ranch's scouts have spotted during the off season. All hunters who have purchased this tag in the past have harvested rams that scored at least 183 B&C points (gross green scores), far above the minimum for entry into the Boone and Crockett all-time records book. Expect to hunt mesa and mountain terrain on the ranch that ranges from 4,200 to 8,600 feet in elevation. Transportation during the hunt will include Jeeps



and UTVs. The ranch headquarters is an immaculate five-star lodge with individual casitas lavishly appointed with exceptional artwork and Santa Fe-inspired antique furnishings. Accommodations are word class, including private villas for all guests, gourmet Mexican meals by a full-time chef, a private spa, a lodge with bar, poker and pool tables, and two dining rooms. In addition to the hunter, the hunt includes one non-hunting guest, and other non-hunters are welcome at the ranch's standard rate, pending availability. This donation includes trophy fees, CITES fees, exportation brokerage fees to the US, and shipping of your trophy to anywhere in the US. Helicopter pickup at the airport is available for an additional fee.

If you plan to bid by phone, arrangements should be made ahead of time with a party attending the fundraising banquet or by contacting the Society's office. You should be on the phone with your bidding representative by 6:55 p.m. If you are the successful bidder, be prepared to provide your name, phone number, and mailing address. Credit card payments will not be accepted for special hunts. Payment should be made out to ADBSS and may be made by personal or cashier's check by June 1, 2024. HUNTS

Navajo Nation non-tribal member general deer or elk tag. The winning bidder for this tag will be able to choose from any of the general deer or general elk hunts that will be published in the 2024-2025 Navajo Nation Non-Navajo Big Game Hunting Proclamation. As mentioned in the description of the trophy deer hunt, the Navajo Nation has some truly huge mule deer, and they have some monster elk as well. The better tags on the reservation are extremely tough to draw, and this is your opportunity to be 100% sure of having the tag of your choice in your pocket this fall. While this is not a special deer or elk tag, it's an opportunity you don't want to miss out on!

Hawaii hybrid sheep hunt. This is a two-day guided hunt for a hybrid sheep (European mouflon/Hawaiian sheep) for **one hunter**. It is a fair chase hunt that will take place on 13,000 acres of private land on the west slope of Mauna Loa Mountain on the big island of Hawaii. Note that a pure mouflon cannot be taken on the hunt; the donor points out that "there is a \$7000 trophy fee and he or she is walking down the mountain" if a pure mouflon is shot. If your shot (rifle or bow) draws blood, the animal is considered to be harvested. Lodging, meals, and transportation in the field are included with the donation. The donation does not include ground transportation to and from the meeting point, lodging prior to or after the hunt, care of the meat and trophy, hunting license, or gratuities. The winning bidder may also bring along a youth hunter (15 years or younger) to hunt a Hawaiian ram, and the hunt must be completed by May 11, 2025.

Iberian mouflon sheep hunt in Spain. This four-day hunt for **one hunter** can be taken in either 2024 or 2025. Included with the donation are reception at Madrid's International Airport, assistance with gun clearance and gun permit fees, all land transportation, four days accommodations and meals, an English-speaking professional hunter, scouting of the area before the hunter's arrival, and the trophy fee for one Iberian mouflon sheep. The hunt can be upgraded for additional days and additional game at a rate of \$890/day per hunter and \$390/day per observer. The \$4,900 trophy fee for the mouflon sheep can be applied toward trophy fees for other available game such as four species of ibex, two species of chamois, Iberian red deer, fallow deer, Balearean boc, aoudad, and roe deer (check with the donor for availability of other species; trophy fees range from \$3,900 for roe deer to \$8,900 for Gredos ibex). Not included with the donation are hunting insurance (\$95), hunting license (\$295/state), and a 21% VAT on the total value.



Oregon Columbian blacktail deer hunt. Of all the deer species in North America, the Columbian blacktail is probably the most difficult to find a good hunt for. Well, here's your opportunity to take an exceptional Columbian blacktail! This five-day fully-guided rifle hunt for **one hunter** will take place October 21 - 25, which is during the rut for Oregon blacktails. If those dates don't work out for you, you can work out other dates in 2024. The hunt will take place on almost 40,000 acres of private property. If the opportunity arrives, you can also take a black bear at no additional cost other than the tag. Food and lodging are provided with the donation. The hunter will be responsible for flying into Coos Bay Southwest Oregon Regional Airport (OTH) and the donor will pick him or her up there. An additional hunter can accompany the winning bidder for a cost of \$5500.

Ontario black bear hunt. This seven-night, six-day guided black bear hunt for two hunters takes place in northwestern Ontario in a vast boreal forest consisting of 400 square miles of hunting opportunity. The hunt can be taken between August 15 and October 15 of 2024 or between May 15 and June 15 of 2025. The hunt utilizes ladder stands and/or ground blinds overlooking prebaited sites that are one to three miles apart. Transportation to and from the Thunder Bay Airport is provided. Accommodations at this remote location consist of fully equipped and well maintained camper trailers with a central outdoor kitchen that includes a propane griddle, barbeque grill, and pots and pans. In addition to setting you up at your stand, your guides will assist with skinning, cutting, and quartering of meat, and then putting it in a freezer until

Ontario wolf hunt plus ice fishing. This seven-night, six-day fully guided hunt for two hunters can be taken in November or December of 2024. You will be provided transportation to and from the airport at Thunder Bay and you'll stay in a deluxe waterfront cottage on Whitefish Lake with all the amenities (full kitchen, linens, sauna, satellite TV, free WiFi, BBQ, and your own personal hot tub). The hunt takes place from heated shacks at baited sites. At the bait sites, you can even ice fish for walleye, perch, and northern pike while you're waiting for a wolf! Transportation to and from the bait site is provided, along with tracking and retrieval of your wolf plus skinning and freezing of

the hide. Hunting license, export tags, and food/drink are not provided with the donation. A hunting license from your state of residence and hunter education certification are required to get your Ontario hunting license. An orange hunting vest is also required. Check that grey ghost off your bucket list!

Montana deer hunt (muley or whitetail). This private land, guided hunt for one hunter will take place on the Flying Shithouse Ranch, an operating cattle ranch that runs for ten miles along the Sun River near Augusta, Montana. You will have eight days on the ranch from arrival to departure. The hunt is scheduled to take place in 2025 but could be slipped a year or two if you don't draw in 2025. Montana's draw procedures are somewhat complex, so it is strongly recommended that you contact the donor, who will assist you in this effort, as soon as possible (tags will be at your expense). You will be staying in a beautifully restored 150 year old log house with a fully equipped kitchen. Meals are not provided with the hunt, but there are restaurants just a mile away if you decide not to utilize the kitchen for meals. If you fly into a nearby city for the hunt, it is recommended that you rent a pickup to get to the ranch. Other hunters can be added at the donor's standard rates. This ranch has produced some outstanding trophy deer; don't miss out!

South Dakota pheasant hunt. This is a three-day professionally guided hunt near Pollock, South Dakota (about 1 1/2 hours south of Bismarck, North Dakota) for **two hunters.** Each hunter can take up to five pheasants a day (including three wild birds during South Dakota's open season) over bird dogs from 800 acres of private preserve that has both wild and supplemented birds and an additional 4500 acres of private wild free ranging habitat. The trip can be taken between August and November of either 2024 or 2025. The donation includes four nights lodging, all meals and beverages, cleaning of your birds, and transportation during the trip. Guides and dogs are provided, but you are welcome to bring your own bird dog if you would like. Tips, license fees, shotgun rental, ammunition, and transport to and from Pollock are not included.

North Dakota waterfowl hunt. Here's your opportunity to pursue ducks, Canada and specked geese, and perhaps even a tundra swan in a variety of locations around Bismarck, North Dakota - a land that has them all! This is a four day/four night hunt for **two hunters** and can take place between mid-October and mid-November of either 2024 or 2025. You will hunt ponds, fields, rivers, sloughs, or even parking lots if that's where the birds want to land! Be sure to bring your waders. Lodging is provided, along with family-style meals, beverages, great guides and dogs, and field dressing of your birds. Tips, licenses, and shotgun/ammunition rental are not included.

Florida management alligator hunt. How's this for a unique opportunity? This is a fully guided three-day hunt for **one hunter**, with lodging and meals provided, and can be taken in 2024 or 2025 on the dates arranged with the donor. The winning bidder will be able to harvest a gator of under eight feet on nearly 400,000 acres of privately-owned cattle ranches in central Florida. Processing and shipping of the meat is available. The nearest airports are in Orlando and Melbourne, and the hunter is responsible for transportation to the ranch. The hunt can be upgraded to allow taking a ten foot alligator and/ or taking a wild hog for an additional fee negotiated with the donor.

The unit has great age class and genetics, and it has the potential to produce 180" to 200" bucks. The hunter will have access to over 500,000 acres of private ranches. This will be a five-day fully outfitted hunt with meals, lodging, and one-on-one guide service provided. The hunter can choose between the general rifle season (Nov 2-6th 2024) and the general muzzleloader season (October 26 -30th 2024), or the hunt can be rolled to those same seasons in 2025.
